



A Funding Option for Neighborhood Projects

As a 501(c)3 charitable organization, the Brewster Ponds Coalition is willing to accept tax-deductible donations for specific pond improvement projects and to hold those funds in a restricted account.

Basic requirements:

- The recipient must be an organization such as a pond or neighborhood association.
- Funds held must be used for purposes that protect or improve the health of Brewster's Ponds.
- The BPC will disperse funds to the neighborhood association as the project moves forward.

 - Working with the Town of Brewster and others to identify and correct problems affecting pond water quality.

Annual Elections



Background

In accordance with the Bylaws of the Brewster Ponds Coalition, election of Directors takes place at the Annual Meeting of the Corporation.

The Board of Directors has three staggered three-year terms with three positions in each term:

2016 - Karen Malkus-Benjamin, Dawn Walnut, and Konrad Schultz

2017 - John Keith, Tom Vautin, Open Position (formerly Rick Kuzman)

2018 - Gwen Pelletier, Patricia Monahan (appointed to succeed Tony Ortiz, Open Position

Board members may serve up to two consecutive regular (full) terms.

Officers are nominated and elected by the Board of Directors at the first meeting following the Annual Meeting.

The election of a new Nominating Committee for the next year also takes place at each Annual Meeting.

Proposed Slate of Nominees



The Nominating Committee proposes the following slate for election to the Brewster Ponds Coalition Board:

- 1. Re-elect Karen Malkus-Benjamin, Dawn Walnut, and Konrad Schultz to three year terms ending in 2019.
- 2. Elect Patricia Monahan for the balance of the current term ending in 2018.
- 3. Elect Judy Pirani to fill the open position ending in 2017.
- 4. Elect Susan Day Searles to fill the open position ending in 2018.
